Regulation 1251/70 (EEC)
Directive 75/34/EEC

Right of permanent residence according to Art. 17 of Directive 2004/38/EC

Basic requirement: exercise of the right to free movement in accordance with Article 7 of Directive 2004/38/EC for a stay of more than 3 months

Custody of children?

Children are EU citizens or born in the host country

Right to remain according to Art. 13 para. 2 lit. b
Directive 2004/38/EC

Spouse (partner) of a Union citizen?

3 years married/partner Residence min.

1 year

Right to remain according to Art. 13 para. 2 lit. a Directive 2004/38/EC Uninterrupted residence of at least 5 years in the host country

EU citizen or family member

Right of permanent residence pursuant to Art. 16 para. 1 of the Directive 2004/38/EC

Residence at least 10 years

Right of permanent residence in accordance with Art. 16 para. 2 of Directive 2004/38/EC

Uninterrupted residence of at least 5 years in the host country

+ Employed/self-employed or sufficient means of subsistence + Health Insurance

Residence at least 10 years

Special protection against expulsion in accordance with Art. 28 of Directive 2004/38/EC

EU FREE MOVEMENT Card Validity

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Relocation to another Member State with permanent residence?

"Continuous" residence in another member state for more than 6 years

Note: After 6 years of residence in another member state, a new right of permanent residence should already have been acquired there!

Basic requirement: An EU residence card or an EU permanent residence card has been issued on the basis of Directive 2004/38/EC

CARD REMAINS VALID

for a maximum of six months

Exception: relocation to another member state for a maximum of

2 years

IMPORTANT: Even if the card is invalid, there may still be a right to freedom of movement regardless of this!

CARD LOSES VALIDITY

SCHENGEN VISA SHORT STAY

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Default Case

Direct line: spouse (partner), children


- Visa must be valid ONLY upon entry at an EXTERNAL BORDER
- Visa CAN also be issued directly at the EXTERNAL BORDER (not recommended)
- max. 90 days per member state
- Internal border crossing ALSO possible with EXPIRED visa
- Proof of family relationship required (marriage certificate/birth certificate)
- Return ticket not required (reservation recommended!)
- Proof of accommodation not required
- Incoming health insurance not required (but recommended!)

Schengen visa for family members of EU citizens Spouse (partner)/family visits together with the EU citizen and mainly (!) in another(!) EU Member State of which the EU citizen is not a citizen

Extended: parents, siblings including parents and siblings of non-EU citizens if they are married to an EU citizen

- Alimony is "necessary" and is paid OR has lived with the EU citizen in the home country OR serious personal reasons make care necessary
- The amount of alimony is not decisive
- Exceeding the period of validity is not recommended
- Health insurance recommended
- Return ticket recommended
- Otherwise see standard case on the left

Normal Schengen visa
Friend, tourist visits the home country of
the inviting person



- max. 90 days per 180 days for the entire Schengen area
- Willingness to return required
- wide discretionary power of the authorities
- Outward and return ticket required
- Proof of accommodation required
- Declaration of commitment may be required
- Incoming health insurance required

Stay more than 90 days in one member state

ONLY possible for family members who are employed/self-employed or have sufficient means of subsistence and health insurance

REGISTRATION REQUIRED
